Phoenix independent cinema isn't your average multiplex. Their four screens showcase the freshest independent & arthouse films alongside the latest blockbusters. Curated festivals explore iconic classics, while themed global screenings and genre-focused events keep things exciting and varied.

Cinema goers can also access Phoenix's free exhibition space, featuring work by internationally renowned artists and photographers, often with a thematic link to film.

The on-site cafe and restaurant allows visitors to refuel with healthy, locally sourced meals, providing the opportunity to mingle with fellow creatives, and **Nest**, their rooftop bar, also gives you the chance to soak up the sun as you look out over the Cultural Quarter.

ART IN THE CULTURAL QUARTER



The Cultural Quarter is the centre of Leicester's artistic scene. This is where the world-renowned **Bring the Paint** festival began, leaving a legacy of striking street murals and everevolving outdoor art. To complement this, the Cultural Quarter boasts a vibrant network of exhibition spaces, seamlessly joining the indoor and outdoor galleries.

The LCB Depot features a constantly evolving exhibition space, where installations exploring design, fashion, and even Al art are showcased throughout the year alongside special shows by local and international artists. In recent years they have linked with Derby's International Photography Festival - FORMAT - showcasing creativity from around the world!



Two Queens gallery is the place where local artists work can be seen, alongside their displays and special events, and Leicester Print Workshop offers classes, courses and workshops in print making. And now The Real Ale Classroom and Exchange bar take work from the LCB Depot exhibitions, becoming an extension of the exhibition space and broadening their reach.





And don't forget Helsinki, the city's top LGBTQ+ club, which has been a Leicester nightlife staple for over 40 years.

A HOME FOR CREATIVE BUSINESSES



LCB DEPOT

LCB Depot is the beating heart of the Cultural Quarter, a place for co-working and to meet, eat, network, and find a home for your creative business. LCB offers support, advice, office space, great meeting rooms a vibrant calendar of creative, business and social events, and is home to award-winning Gray's Kitchen and an independent book shop, Got Enough Books.

Explore the Cultural Quarter with food nights, art exhibitions, networking for creatives, comedy, spoken word, creative family days, makers markets, popup shops, and much more. Get involved with the city's top creative scene meet-up Last Friday, featuring food, music, and more, attracting thousands on the last Friday of every month. There are regular CQ Late events which include club nights, after parties, pop up shops and gigs plus family-focused CQ Earlies which offer engaging hands-on activities for the kids on Saturday afternoons.



CREATIVE Businesses

The Cultural Quarter is a hub for creative businesses, including established design agencies like Arch Creative, Some Bright Spark, Mojo, ImageNova, OnPoynt and Effect Digital. The national headquarters of music licensing company PPL PRS also calls the former Leicester Mercury Building home, solidifying the area's connection to the creative industries and a range of young and inspiring businesses work from the offices at Colton Square, including the HQ of Octopus Energy.





MAKERS' YARD

Based in the city's oldest hosiery factories, now repurposed as a home for creatives, **Makers' Yard** is a studio space for artists and designer makers. This award-winning, dynamic and inspiring workspace is home to a wide range of creative entrepreneurs, artists, makers and artisans.

As a hosiery factory the building dates back to 1854 and played a key role in the first and second world wars, producing clothing for our troops.

Later on the 'swinging sixties' brought

a huge boost to the city, with Leicester becoming known as "the city that clothes the world", and the 'Charnwood Hosiery Factory' produced clothes for all, including socks for Liverpool FC, Manchester United and of course, Leicester City, plus the little known TV star Terry Wogan.

Following its abandonment in 2002 and Grade II Listing status in 2006 Makers' Yard was lovingly restored in 2013. Today the building offers a range of dedicated single-let studios and shared space for smaller enterprises, continuing that tale of creativity and making.

LIVE MUSIC


Being a creative area, of course the Cultural Quarter is full of great places to hear the latest artists!

The Soundhouse and The Shed are your go-to spots for discovering the hottest local acts, with the occasional touring gem thrown in the mix. For those nights where you crave soulful sounds, Brick and Beam bar boasts incredible live jazz artists and DJs spinning sets on weekends.

LCB Depot is also the place to hear some live music with their regular events and showcases. Country and western comes to Orton Square with new venue **Baton Rouge** showcasing the ever popular genre with regular music nights and open mic spots alongside great food and a healthy dose of good ol' southern hospitality. You can also catch small scale shows at **The Real Ale Classroom** and **The Exchange**.

For those in search of something a little different and just a short walk from the Cultural Quarter is **The Musician**, offering a dose of blues, roots, and Americana from top touring artists and local musicians.

Right on the edge of the Cultural Quarter you can find **HQ Recording**, an award winning grassroots music production facility. They provide a relaxed, creative high quality studio environment across two rooms, with the latest in cutting edge digital software and hardware.





LIVING & STAYING IN THE CULTURAL QUARTER

Live in the heart of the action at the Cultural Quarter and find yourself a short stroll from the main shopping areas and historic core of the city. Leicester's Cultural Quarter is packed with new-build stylish apartments, sitting alongside loft conversions and refurbishments of old factories. Many of our top cultural producers are based in the area, thanks to spaces such as LCB Depot and Phoenix Square - an important hub for creative tech businesses, offering 30 workspace studios across 3 floors. The Big Difference Company run the Leicester Comedy Festival, the biggest comedy festival in Europe, which welcomes the top stars of stand up. Inspirate are responsible for An Indian Summer Festival which brings a flavour of South Asia to the Cultural Quarter every summer, and ArtReach, who are the creative minds behind the Journeys Festival International, Light Up Leicester and Re/Thread.



Let the kids burn off some energy at **Boost Trampoline Park** or you could sign up to an authentic **Bikram Yoga** class and sweat it out at this boutique hot yoga studio, located just across from the LCB Depot.
